Sunday, April 21: Washington (home of Thomas Affleck), Natchez Trace Parkway, Port Gibson (lunch in the Garden District), and Vicksburg National Battlefield Park. Minimum of 30 people required. Separate fee (including lunch): \$60.00

POST CONFERENCE TOURS

Monday, April 22 (minimum of 15 people required)

BATON ROUGE, with AIRPORT DROP-OFF (for flights checking in 1 p.m. or later): tour Windrush Gardens and L.S.U. experiment station (famous rose garden); a brief stop at Rosedown in St. Francisville for those returning to Natchez.

JACKSON, with AIRPORT DROP-OFF (for flights checking in at 1 p.m. or later): tour Eudora Welty's garden and historic neighborhoods in Jackson; stop at Mississippi State Experiment Station in Crystal Springs (famous for Mississippi Medallion

ornamental plants) for those returning to Natchez. Separate fees (including admissions): Airport drop-off \$35.00; Full-day excursion (Dutch-treat lunch) \$50.00

REGISTRATION

Registration must be made in advance by completing and returning the registration form. Registration for the Annual Meeting is limited to 160 participants on a first-come, first-serve basis. Confirmation will be sent by E-mail if an address is provided on the registration form.

The registration fee of \$225 includes all activities on Thursday afternoon and evening, Friday and Saturday, including lectures, transportation, tours, admissions, receptions and meals as noted. An additional \$60 is required for the optional Sunday tour. The post-conference tours on Monday are offered at \$35 for the half-day with airport drop-off, and at \$50 for the full day round trip to Natchez (lunch is Dutch-treat for the Monday tours).

In case of cancellation, fees cannot be refunded after April 1, 2002.

Attendance at this event is limited to members of the Southern Garden History Society. Annual membership dues begin at \$20 for an individual membership. Conference Headquarters, Registration, and program sessions: *The Natchez Eola Hotel*, 110 North Pearl Street, Natchez, MS, ph 1-866-445-3652 or 1-601-445-6000, fax 1-601-446-5310. 60 rooms are available at the conference rate of \$89 (single or double occupancy) in this small, recently restored hotel, a member of Historic Hotels of America, so please make your reservations directly with the Natchez Eola as soon as possible, and no later than March 15, 2002. Please be sure to tell them that you are attending the Southern Garden History Society Conference in order to receive the conference rate.

There are other hotels, guest houses, and B & B's in the downtown area, some of which are within walking distance of the Conference Headquarters, which are listed on the enclosed sheet. You may make your reservations directly with these facilities or you may contact the reservations service at Natchez Pilgrimage Tours, ph. 1-800-647-6742 or 1-601-446-6631. There is no conference discount.

GETTING TO NATCHEZ

By car: Natchez is located at the junction of U.S. Highway 61

(north-south) and U. S. Highways 84-98 (east-west), approximately 60 miles south of Interstate 20 at Vicksburg, 60 miles west of Interstate 55 at Brookhaven, and 85 miles north of Interstate 10 at Baton Rouge. It is also accessible by the Natchez Trace Parkway from Nashville, Tennessee and Jackson, Mississippi (the National Park Service Rangers strictly enforce a 50 m.p.h. speed limit)

By air: Baton Rouge (Louisiana) is the closest airport (approximately 85 miles). Jackson (Mississippi) is the principal airport for central Mississippi (approximately 120 miles). The Conference can arrange van service to Natchez (Thursday only) and return (Sunday or Monday) at a reasonable fee provided enough people request this (minimum of 6 people each way). Please let us know as soon as possible if you will need this service. Rental cars are available at both airports.

By rail: Amtrak service is available in Mississippi, with rail lines from Chicago to New Orleans passing through Jackson and Brookhaven (approximately 60 miles east of Natchez), and from Washington and the northeast to New Orleans passing through Meridian and Hattiesburg, 180 miles northeast and east respectively. Days of service and availability of seats are limited. Public transportation and rental cars are not available except in New Orleans and Jackson.
