## *The Society*

The Southern Garden History Society was founded in early 1982 as an outgrowth of a continuing series of conferences at Old Salem, North Carolina on "Restoring Southern Gardens and Landscapes." Its purpose is to promote the study of the history of landscapes, gardening and horticulture in the South, collaborating with the American Horticultural Society and other similar organizations in the United States and abroad which have the same objectives of preservation and restoration.

The Society will endeavor to locate and index relevant materials. Its future plans include the establishment of a library housing documents, plans, designs, drawings, catalogs, papers, photographs and slides connected with the study of southern garden history. The geographic area which the Society encompasses includes Alabama, Arkansas, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, and West Virginia.

Membership dues are \$15 yearly. An annual meeting will be held each April, in a different part of the South if possible, to hear reports of research and projects of members, to hear lectures and to visit gardens of historic importance in the vicinity.
