
CHARTER MEMBERS

Gifts may also be made online through the Society's website. The Society, a 501c3 non-profit, recently established the Flora Ann Bynum Endowment Fund with the North Carolina Community Foundation. Society funds are used to publish *Magnolia*, provide annual meeting scholarships, and support other Society initiatives.
